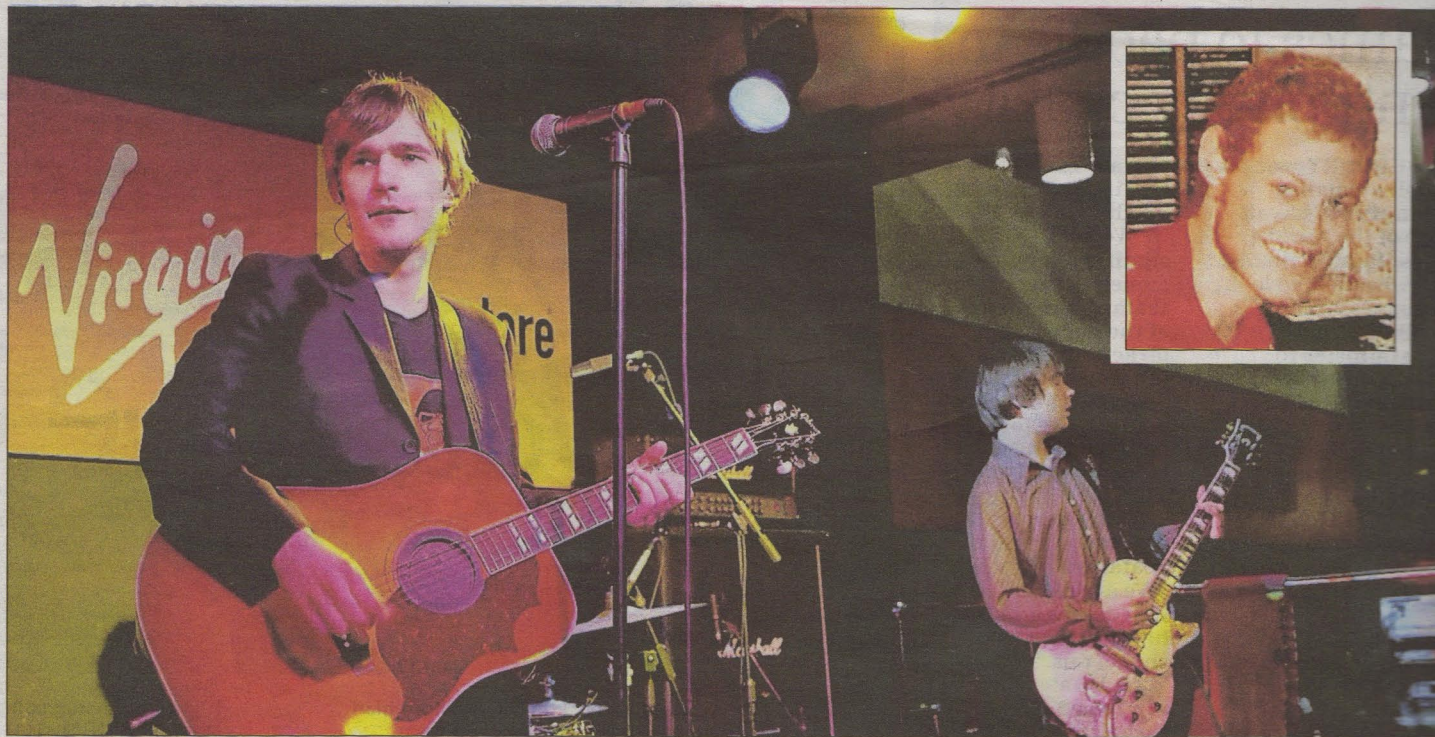

# Festival signs second major act

A FESTIVAL to honour a popular young man and talented musician has announced the latest headline act to perform this year.

Britpop band Dodgy has already signed up for the two-day LeeStock event in memory of 21-year-old Lee

Dunford, from Sudbury, who died in 2006.

Ed Keogh, 25, who organises the festival for his friend, has announced that Mark Morriss, lead singer of the Bluetones, will also be performing.

Mr Keogh said: "We are delighted to add Mark to our

line-up and feel both he and Dodgy will add to the excellent line-up we already have this year."

LeeStock, held at the White Horse in Sudbury, raises money for the Willow Foundation following the death of Mr Dunford after his four-and-a-half-year battle
